1. The meeting was called to order at 2:15 pm
2. WRS declared the presence of a quorum (62% members present)
3. Minutes of the previous meeting
 - 3.1 JAE corrected for 6.4. The phase 1 and phase 2 of the PPS website development were done.
 - 3.2 Dr. Carmelo A. Alfiler pointed out that in page 8, item 9.13, JAE mentioned that the mandatory expenses total about 6 million pesos every month. Dr. Alfiler asked if this is a typo error. In page 6, the total disbursements for the year only amount to 51 million pesos.
 - 3.3 Dr. Esperanza F. Rivera motioned for the approval of the minutes of the previous meeting. This was seconded by Dr. Carmelo A. Alfiler.
4. Business matters arising from the minutes
 - 4.1 There were no business matters arising from the minutes from the previous meeting.
5. FUT announce PPS Awardees
 - 5.1 Dr. Lulu C. Bravo was awarded the Outstanding Pediatrician of 2023
 - 5.2 Southern Tagalog Chapter was awarded the Outstanding Chapter in Child Advocacy and Community Service and Outstanding Chapter in Continuing Professional Development.
 - 5.3 Dr. Melinda M. Atienza informed everyone that the PPS chapter award on Continuing Professional Development is also called the Dr. Rolando S. Songco Award in Continuing Professional Development and the Chapter Award on Child Advocacy is the Dr. Perla Santos-Ocampo Award on Child Advocacy and the Chapter Award in Community Service is the Dr. Fe del Mundo Award in Community Service.
6. President's Report
 - 6.1 FUT presented the achievements of the current board of trustees.
 - 6.2 A strategic planning was held last August 24 – 25, 2022 with Mr. Jonathan Yabut as the facilitator.

- 6.2.1 With the theme: “Continuity, Sustainability and Harmony”, the National Officers, Board of Trustees, newly elected Chapter Presidents and the Council of Advisers who were present had sharing of ideas and goals for the Philippine Pediatric Society.
- 6.2.2 The output focused on streamlining the different working committees of the different councils to work in sync and continue the gains of previous leaderships.
- 6.3 The PPS boasts of 6,976 members with 4198 diplomate, 2561 fellow and 217 emeritus fellows who work singly and in collaboration to effect change.
- 6.4 Cluster Reorganization
 - 6.4.1 To be more inclusive, an improvement to the definition of the NCR clusters was made.
 - 6.4.2 The re-definition of the PPS Clusters now include a group of PPS members based in NCR and Rizal Province with or without hospital affiliation and organized to support the activities of the PPS.
 - 6.4.3 The objectives are to enhance the efficiency of the PPS clusters in the areas of information dissemination, coordination and collaboration, promote active engagement of members on PPS initiatives, advocacies, activities through a revised and more structured framework of operations and lastly, support PPS cluster “member-centric” led projects in the areas of CME, research, community extension services and advocacy.
 - 6.4.4 Cluster Reorganization: (Cluster 1) Manila; (Cluster 2) Quezon City, San Juan, Mandaluyong and Pasig; (Cluster 3) Caloocan, Malabon, Navotas and Valenzuela; (Cluster 4) Makati, Pasay, Parañaque, Las Piñas, Muntinlupa, Pateros and Taguig; (Cluster 5) Marikina and Rizal Province
- 6.5 Continuous Improvement and Valuing Assets
 - 6.5.1 Coinciding with the culmination of the term of office of the outgoing Officers and members of the BOT, Ms. Josie Sebetero and Ms. Teresa Victoria, senior office staff filed for early retirement. This led to the hiring of Mrs. Leticia Doblado, who assumed the position of Administrative Officer on June 15, 2022.
 - 6.5.2 Mrs. Doblado became responsible for providing support to the PPS Staff. Her duties included the supervision and monitoring of the day-to-day office operations and overseeing the PPS Staff.
 - 6.5.3 The PPS building is continually being refurbished to adhere to existing standards. We are in the process of working on complying with the annual inspection report of the Quezon City Engineering Department received in January 2023. With careful study and review of the recommendations and presented to the BOT by the Building Management Committee, our resident consultant Architect, Jimmy P. Lacuesta is working with his team to deliver the project.
- 6.6 Investing in the New: Improved Information Technology System
 - 6.6.1 We have a new ICT consultant, Mr. Jamie Dy. He is helping us with the integration of online services into one ecosystem.
 - 6.6.2 Our previous system deployments are all silo, each system, and sites have their own login credentials making it difficult to use by PPS members.
 - 6.6.3 We aim to save 80 percent of IT cost. In a short time, we have already deployed AWS servers hosting our own website, E Learning Services, CPD online and Trainees, and Mail Server.

6.7 Education and Training Continues

- 6.7.1 To date, there are 120 accredited pediatric residency training programs: 50 level I, 46 level II, 17 level III and 6 level IV. There are two accredited subspecialty rotation hospitals: Research on Infectious and Tropical Medicine (RITM) and Philippine Heart Center (PHC)
- 6.7.2 The conduct of WISE exams continued where 1806 residents (112/118 HAB hospitals) participated. This evaluation helped HAB hospitals evaluate their trainees and improve training being offered by the institutions
- 6.7.3 The written examination on November 16, 2023 was held virtually via Zoom. 197 out of 267 examinees passed the exam which translates to a passing rate of 73.7%.
- 6.7.4 The recent written examination last March 15, 2023 was held at the PPS building with a total of 297 examinees. 226 passed the exam with a passing rate of 76.1%.
- 6.7.5 The oral examination on November 25 and 27, 2023 was also held virtually via Zoom. 129 out of the 151 examinees successfully passed the exam obtaining a passing rate of 86.75%.
- 6.7.6 The recent oral examination last March 24 and 26, 2023 was held at the PPS building. There were 231 out of 245 examinees who passed the exam which corresponds to a passing rate of 94.7%.

6.8 PPS CPR MODULE

- 6.8.1 This administration embarked on a project to produce our very own local version of a pediatric resuscitation adapted for the Filipino children. It was designed to impart the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively recognize early signs of shock and respiratory distress and failure, the most common causes of cardiopulmonary arrest in children.
- 6.8.2 The activity was chaired by Dr. John Fernandez and was launched on December 8, 2022 at the Luxent Hotel. The BOT, Past Presidents, PPS CPR Committee members, SPCCMP officers and HAB Chairs were in attendance to witness the setting in motion of this endeavor.

6.9 PPS in Action

- 6.9.1 To ensure that more children are served, the amount of advocacy funds to support and augment community projects annually for each PPS Chapter was increased from Php 75,000 in 2022 to Php 100,000 in 2023.
- 6.9.2 It was absolutely necessary to teach future trainers about Dengue, a prevalent disease in our country. The PPS Dengue Integrated Program Workshop and Training of trainers spearheaded by Dr Ronald Limchui and the PPS Central Visayas chapter aimed to train and update the participants on the advances and best practices in dengue management and community prevention. This ensured that the vital knowledge was shared and spread to the institutions nationwide.
- 6.9.3 Because breastfeeding rates have remained low and there was a growing global concern on promotion of milk formulas, a task force was created to look into the compliance of the pediatricians with EO 51. Last March 17, 2023, the Chair, Dr. Juliet S. Aguilar and co-Chair Dr. Edwin V. Rodriguez, convened with the advisers namely, Dr. Florentina U. Ty, Dr. Esperanza F. Rivera and Atty Esteban B. Nancho

6.10 Noteworthy Events and Programs

- 6.10.1 Because breastfeeding rates have remained low and there was a growing global concern on promotion of milk formulas, a task force was created to look into the compliance of the pediatricians with EO 51.

- 6.10.2 Last March 17, 2023, the Chair, Dr. Juliet S. Aguilar and co-Chair Dr. Edwin V. Rodriguez, convened with the advisers namely, Dr. Florentina U. Ty, Dr. Esperanza F. Rivera and Atty Esteban B. Nancho
 - 6.10.3 This year’s 60th Annual Convention, with the theme “Hindsight Insight Foresight: A 360-Degree Vision Toward Excellent Pediatric Care”, is another milestone for the PPS. Chaired by Dr. Jose B. Salazar and organized by the UERM Department of Pediatrics, this first Hybrid Convention is a mixture of in-person and online participation.
 - 6.10.4 In November 2024, the PPS will be the host organization of the 18th Asia Pacific Congress of Pediatrics, with our very own APPA President-elect, Dr. Joselyn A. Eusebio as the Overall Chair. With the theme “Redesigning the Horizon of Pediatric Healthcare in the Asia Pacific”, the congress will be held in Cebu City.
 - 6.11 Collaboration with National and International Partners
 - 6.11.1 Asia Dengue Summit in Singapore
 - 6.11.2 Zero vaccine with the UNICEF, Rwanda, Africa
 - 6.11.3 Measles Rubella Polio Supplemental Immunization Activity (MR-Polio SIA) program with the Department of Health

9. FUT Started the Open Forum

9.1 Question: Was PPS able to apply their sponsors for IAC approval headed by DOH? *JBS informed everyone that we wrote IAC and was delivered to DOH. Another letter was made addressed to the FDA. No response was given until May 14, 2023. The only company that would still be in question was another milk company for which the entire lecture was scrapped. We followed the recommendation of IAC.*

9.2 Question: We would like to ask the basis for the finalists of the research poster contest. How can you choose the finalists based on abstract and not poster if this is a research poster contest? *JBS said that it was adopted in the 2022 activity. The research poster was separated from the research paper. JBS will forward the criteria.*

9.3 Question: Are we able to gauge if we were able to spend more or less for a hybrid vs pure virtual and FTF convention? *JBS answered that the hybrid is more expensive than a FTF convention. A survey was conducted before the platform of the convention was finalized. Hybrid was the choice of the majority. A lot of adaptations were done to entice members to participate. We have 2500 – 3000 visits to the commercial booths.*

9.4 Question: Were we given a soft copy of the Annual Report? *WRS answered yes, it is available in the PPS website a week before the annual convention. It was also forwarded to the chapter presidents, cluster heads and HAB hospitals.*

9.5 Question: Will the RFID used in the previous convention will still be useful in the next convention? *JBS said that the renewal of the RFID was not extended. QR code was used for this convention.*

9.6 Question: Will we having the hybrid set up again for the next convention? *JBS answered that there are advantages and disadvantages that have to be weigh carefully. We might get a survey again for 2024 Annual Convention. It will be up to the next host as well.*

9.7 Question: Who gets the copy of PPS Coffee table book? PPS spent a certain amount for that. Why are we asking donations from societies? *FXD answered that it is a commemorative book. The proceeds will go to our Piso para sa Scholar project. We have limited copies of it. Buying the book is not mandated but voluntary.*

9.8 Question: What caused the lack of kits this annual convention? *JBS answered that we have only allotted 3500 kits for the FTF convention. JBS apologized for those who have not gotten the kits.*

9.9 There was a comment form Dr. Emma Llanto to include in the computation the amount saved in hotel and travel expenses. Hybrid will still be economical for PPS members.

- 9.10 Question: Why was there no certificate of attendance included in our registration kits like before? *WRS answered that the certificate can be downloaded from the platform provided.*
- 9.11 Question: Can virtual attendees get a discount from the annual convention? *JBS said that when they are discussing the registration fees, usually FTF rate will be higher compared to the online rate. The reason for giving it the same rate is to entice members to attend FTF.*
- 9.12 Question: Can PPS make a stand on the HMO rate? *Dr. Regalado said that PPS made a stand already. The rates of PPS have the same rates of PCP and POGS.*
- 9.13 Question: Can the PPS recommend to Philhealth and other insurance companies that the reimbursement rates of members of PPS to be higher compared to non-PPS members? This will encourage residents to take the PPS board exam. *CMO said that he will meet with Philhealth at the end of the month. He will discuss the issue with them. AOL said that if you are not board certified, you can't be classified as a pediatrician therefore the reimbursement rates will be lower.*
- 9.14 Question: Can you remind us how many CPD units we need to be given a good standing certificate? *JBS answered that members are required to get 60 PPS units.*
- 9.15 Comment: Hybrid convention should still continue. It is more beneficial for seniors. It is also easy to listen to lectures on demand.
- 9.16 AOL said that the benefits of online platform for the annual convention is recognized. However, hybrid doubles the resources needed. We can make the sessions available online for those who can't attend.
- 9.17 Question/Comment: HMO does not accredit all that have signed the MOA. *Dr. Regalado said that once a member is accredited by PPS, all 13 HMOs will recognize it.*

10. Reports of Councils

- 10.1 MMR corrected that in page 173, Dr. Carmelo Alfiler is not part of the adviser of the Council on Community Service and Child Advocacy.
- 10.2 EVR said to include the report of Philippine Society of Pediatric Hematology. There was double entry of Philippine Society of Endocrinology and Metabolism. WRS said that it was already corrected in the soft copy.
- 10.3 MMR moved for the approval of the Reports of Councils with corrections. This was seconded by CMO.

11. Reports of Chapters

- 11.1 Dr. Amelia Fernandez moved for the approval of the Reports of Chapters. This was seconded by Dr. Esperanza Rivera.

12. Reports of Subspecialty Societies and Sections


- 12.1 JAE moved for the approval of the Treasurer's Report. This was seconded by FXD.

13. FUT continued the Open Forum

- 13.1 Question: What can the PPS do with dwindling rate of Pediatric residency training applicants? *Dr. Melinda Atienza said that the concern was tackled during the HAB summit. HAB will offer recommendation. Some chairs shared their best practices in increasing the number of residents. We will give the suggestions in the HAB Viber group.*
- 13.2 Question: Can PPS recommend to Philhealth that some managements are not aligned with CPGs? *CMO said that Philhealth has only accredited Pneumonia and Asthma CPGs. They will be meeting at the end of the month to discuss CPGs.*

- 13.3 Question: How much is our present cash standing, investments and liabilities for general information? *FXD answered that our total assets is 345 million. It was presented a while ago.*
- 13.4 Question: Can members be given certificate of attendance for Official time? *WRS said yes, it is available per request.*
- 13.5 Question: Can the secretariat email the official receipt? *WRS said for members of the chapter, it will be given to the president. For HAB hospitals, it will be given to the chair.*
- 13.6 Question: Why can't non HAB accredited hospitals be allowed to be part of PPS consortium of HAB hospitals? Non HAB hospitals are preparing for accreditation and it will be beneficial for their residents. *MMA said they can have individual arrangements with the HAB chairs to attend activities including observership.*
- 13.7 Question: Can we look into having our publication journal where members' researches can be published? *WRS said that we have one and we are in the process in having it available in the PPS website.*
14. Other matters
- 14.1 CMO attended a meeting called by DOH about the Espesyalista para sa Bayan Program. They are calling for PPS members to work in a government hospital as a Medical Specialist II (Full time). Guidelines are available in the DOH website.
- 14.2 The Host institution for the 61st PPS Annual convention is UST Hospital – Department of Pediatrics. The Department Chair is WRS and the Over-all Chair is EVR.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

MAY 2023 – APRIL 2024

Title: Leadership Reflections: Pioneering Initiatives and Triumphs in the Aftermath of a Pandemic

As I reflect on my two-year tenure as the President of the Philippine Pediatric Society, I am profoundly grateful for the opportunity to have worked alongside brilliant and righteous esteemed officers and members of the 2022 to 2024 Board of Trustees. Membership Grants, Benefits and Assistance

The PPS continued its dedicated support for its members by reaffirming its commitment to assisting members both in times of need and professional growth. It approved a total of P295,000.00 for a total number of 19 grants to members for Research Forum and Poster Presentation across local and international conventions. PPS has ensured prompt provision of sickness benefits and has provided a sum of P120,000.00 to 4 of our members and has extended compassionate support of P140,000.00 through 2 death benefits to families.

- Written Examination

The recently concluded Specialty Board face-to-face written examination on March 12, 2024, resulted in 198 out of 243 candidates passing, showcasing a commendable 81.5% pass rate.

Strategic and Enhanced Policies: Streamlining Specialty Board Certification Process

The Specialty Board has implemented a series of strategic initiatives and policy updates to enhance the transparency, accessibility, and efficiency of our board examinations and certification processes. These significant breakthroughs in professional development within the Philippine Pediatric Society underscore our deep commitment to fostering the professional growth and success of pediatric specialists in the Philippines responsive to the needs of the changing times which include the following:

1. Accelerated Special Examination Pathway

Beginning November 2024, candidates who pass the specialty board written examination are immediately eligible to apply for the oral examination. Eliminating the prior requirement for graduates from HAB accredited hospitals to wait two years before applying for the oral examination is a key reform. This modification ensures a more efficient and accelerated route to professional progression, enhancing the overall candidate experience for those seeking board certification. This adjustment reflects our dedication to adapting our accreditation processes to meet the evolving needs of our members and the broader pediatric specialist community.

2. Removal of Research Requirement

The Specialty Board has carefully deliberated and decided to remove the research requirement from its certification requirement checklist, recognizing that while research is essential for hospital accreditation, it should not be a prerequisite for Specialty Board certification. This decision clarifies the distinct functions of the Specialty Board and hospital accreditation entities, streamlining certification criteria.

3. Revised Examination Schedule

In our ongoing effort to improve the examination experience based on feedback, we have adjusted our examination dates. The November examination has been rescheduled to September, and the April examination has been advanced to March. To accommodate these changes, the deadline for submission of requirements for the March exam is now set on Jan 31st, and the September exam schedule is set on July 31st.

This scheduling modification aims to provide examinees and examiners with ample preparation time, facilitating a smoother and more effective examination process as approved by the SB committee and National BOT.

III. Hospital Accreditation Board Initiatives

We have embarked on a series of strategic initiatives and updates to enhance the accreditation framework, broaden the range of subspecialties, and increase the presence of accredited institutions. The following are the notable achievements from the Hospital Accreditation Board:

Alongside them, the five distinguished institutions holding certified Level 4 HAB accreditation status, including the Philippine General Hospital (PGH), University of Santo Tomas (UST), Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC), University of the East Ramon Magsaysay Memorial Medical Center (UERM), and Southern Philippines Medical Center (SPMC) in Davao, remain steadfast as beacons of hope and healing. Together, they shape the landscape of pediatric healthcare in the Philippines with their unwavering dedication to service and innovation.

Reaching New Heights: Distinguished Institutions Achieving Level 4 HAB Accreditation

With a shared dedication to excellence and compassionate care, The Medical City (TMC), St. Luke's Hospital Quezon City, De La Salle University Medical Center, and National Children's Hospital (NCH) proudly stand tall as distinguished institutions recently accredited into Level 4 HAB hospital status. This achievement affirms their unwavering commitment to providing exceptional medical services

to children across the nation, marking a testament to attaining the pinnacle of excellence in pediatric care.

Advancing Pediatric Critical Care: Welcoming New Accredited Training Institutions

In a move to elevate the quality and accessibility of pediatric healthcare services, HAB proudly welcomes two new subspecialty training institutions offering programs from the Society of Pediatric Critical Care Medicine. The Vicente Sotto Memorial Medical Center and Southern Philippines Medical Center have both earned accreditation status for fellowship training in critical care, highlighting their unwavering dedication to excellence and innovation in this essential field of pediatric medicine.

Empowering Healthcare: Digitizing the Hospital Accreditation Board (HAB) Manual

The HAB Manual has undergone a comprehensive update and is now available digitally, making it more accessible for distribution and reference. This digital version serves as an invaluable tool for accredited hospitals, offering detailed insights into accreditation standards, procedures, and best practices. The digital availability ensures that accredited institutions can easily access and implement these accreditation standards.

PPS-PCP Adolescent to Young Adult Health Care Transition (AYA-HCT) Parallel Residency Curriculum Implementation

In January 2019, Dr. Gatchalian convened the Committee on Adolescent Health and Transition Care (AH&TC) headed by Dr. Emma Llanto with Dr. Carmelo A. Alfiler as the adviser.

In February 2020, Dr. Gatchalian initiated discussions with the Philippine College of Physicians (PCP) regarding a collaborative project on Health Care Transition (HCT). Despite disruptions caused by the pandemic, meetings between the PPS and PCP persisted, leading to the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in November 2020. This MOU formalized their partnership to develop an online course tailored for Internal Medicine (IM) residents.

Concurrently, the Committee on Adolescent Health and Transition Care (AH&TC), supported by Dr. Joselyn A. Eusebio, embarked on the development of pediatric adolescent health modules. By 2022, an e-learning course consisting of 8 modules was successfully integrated into the PPS Learning Management System. This milestone was followed by a pilot run and facilitator's training across 5 hospitals, facilitated by Dr. Florentina, to ensure effective implementation.

As of January 2024, efforts on the PPS-PCP project gained momentum, leading to a formal launch in March 2024, which was attended by the PCP Board, notably headed by incumbent PCP Dr. Roentgene Solante. To further refine the modules, a workshop with IM residents is scheduled for April 16, 2024, with plans to incorporate feedback from participants to enhance the effectiveness of the program.

IV. Philippine Pediatric Society Initiatives

Through the concerted efforts and strategic collaborations of the Council of Advocacy and Community Service directors, Dr. Michael M. Resurreccion, Dr. Marianne Naomi N. Poca, and Dr. Elizabeth G. Tan, alongside the cooperation of members from various chapters, committees, and clusters, impactful projects have been launched and spearheaded. These initiatives address pressing health concerns and enhance the expertise of pediatric healthcare professionals nationwide.

The following are the significant Philippine Pediatric Society's initiatives:

a. Expanding Emergency Preparedness: CPR Training in Accredited HAB Hospitals

We have implemented a CPR training module across 120 hospitals accredited by the Hospital Accreditation Board. Qualified instructors stand ready to facilitate training sessions at their respective institutions. This initiative equips healthcare workers with vital life-saving techniques, ensuring their prompt response during emergencies. By extending the reach of CPR training, we enhance the readiness of healthcare teams to deliver effective care to pediatric patients in critical situations.

We've rolled out a CPR training module across 120 hospitals accredited by the Hospital Accreditation Board. Qualified instructors are ready to lead training sessions at their respective institutions. This program arms healthcare workers with crucial life-saving techniques, ensuring their readiness to act swiftly during emergencies. By broadening the availability of CPR training, we're enhancing the capabilities of healthcare teams to provide prompt and effective care to pediatric patients in critical situations.

b. Effective Rollout of the Dengue Integrated Program

This program has been successfully executed across most of our chapters and clusters, benefiting the communities they serve. It focuses on education, prevention, and early detection to combat dengue fever effectively. The concerted efforts of our team have significantly contributed to increasing awareness and diminishing the prevalence of dengue within local populations.

c. AAP Funded Workshop: Combating Vaccine Hesitancy and Empowering Pediatric Healthcare Providers

The Philippine Pediatric Society was awarded a project grant from the American Academy of Pediatrics on February 12, 2023 amounting to US 31,997.00. This project aims to promote initiatives focused on tackling vaccine hesitancy and combating misinformation. Through the efforts and stewardship of Dr. Fatima Gimenez, a capacity-building workshop was initiated to empower pediatric healthcare providers with essential knowledge and resources to promote vaccine acceptance and improve immunization rates. This initiative plays a crucial role in safeguarding children and communities from vaccine-preventable diseases through informed discussions and comprehensive education on vaccination.

d. Tobacco and Nicotine Control Advocacy Group (TNCAG) Initiatives

Collaboration with Public Health Sector: Tobacco and Nicotine Control Advocacy Group (TNCAG) chair, Dr. Rizalina Racquel Gonzalez represented PPS in various initiatives towards effective tobacco control such as:

- Development of Department of Health (DOH) Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) on Nicotine Dependence in conjunction with UP PGH, PCP, and PCCP released in July 2023.
- Conducted the Asian Regional survey from March to April 2023 focusing on Knowledge, Attitudes, and Practices (KAP) regarding cigarettes and vaping among pediatricians. Key findings emphasized the need for anticipatory guidance and tobacco cessation strategies within pediatric practices.
- Signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the DOH to address the health harms associated with smoking and vaping, facilitated through the Health Promotion Bureau in November 2023.
- Youth-Focused Educational Outreach: Developing an ongoing podcast series in collaboration with the Asia Pacific Learning Collaborative Network (APLCN) on tobacco and nicotine control tailored for teens. Scheduled for online streaming via Spotify, YouTube, and Google Play from mid-May to June 2024, coinciding with World No Tobacco Day. Additionally, organizing a Digital Poster Contest targeting Southeast Asian teens to raise awareness against smoking and vaping.

V. Publications and Handbooks

These publications are instrumental in enhancing healthcare practices and nurturing the professional growth of our healthcare providers. Highlighted below are notable achievements in the realm of Publications and Handbooks:

a. Handbook on Therapeutics

The comprehensive "Pediatric Drug Handbook" by Dr. Benjamin G. Co offers critical insights into therapeutic procedures, established best practices, and guidelines aimed at elevating patient care and outcomes.

b. Handbook on Pediatric Infectious Disease

The release of the "Philippine Pediatric Society Handbook on Pediatric Infectious Disease," spearheaded by Dr. Anelyn Reyes, is a landmark achievement in pediatric healthcare. This handbook is an indispensable tool for medical professionals managing pediatric infectious conditions, providing thorough guidance on diagnosis, treatment options, and preventive measures.

c. Fluid & Electrolytes, 2nd Edition

The second edition of "Fluid & Electrolytes" with Dr. Francisco Anacleto Jr. as the lead author expands on its predecessor's foundation, offering healthcare practitioners updated information and evidence-based approaches for addressing fluid and electrolyte disorders.

d. Handbook on Pediatric Preventive Care

The publication of the "Handbook on Pediatric Preventive Care" by Dr. Naomi Nocheseda marks a significant advancement in pediatric healthcare. This guide provides healthcare professionals with crucial strategies and resources to foster preventive care measures, aiming to safeguard the health and well-being of children in our communities.

e. Advancing Pediatric Healthcare: Endorsing Evidence-Based Clinical Practice Guidelines

We proudly advocate for the adoption of several evidence-based Clinical Practice Guidelines across various subspecialties within the Philippine Pediatric Society. These guidelines aim to cultivate a culture of excellence and continual improvement in advancing pediatric care throughout the country.

- Pediatric Cancer Clinical Practice Guideline Turnover: A Milestone in Advancing Pediatric Cancer Care

It is with deep honor that I represented the Philippine Pediatric Society at the Pediatric Cancer Clinical Practice Guideline turnover ceremony during the 5th Anniversary celebration of the National Integrated Cancer Control Act in Davao on February 15, 2024.



The said agreement signifies a strategic partnership aimed at streamlining healthcare delivery, efficient referrals and prompt reimbursement processes while upholding high standards of medical care. The said agreement ensures financial protection for families and the promotion of preventive healthcare measures, benefitting children and their well-being across the Philippines.

IX. Groundwork for PPS Foundation: "Lingap at Aruga sa Batang Pinoy (LAB_PINOY)"

The monumental stride towards the establishment of our own PPS foundation which will be referred to as "Lingap at Aruga sa Batang Pinoy (LAB_PINOY)" has been a long cherished aspiration for many. At its nascent stage, our foundation pledges to champion the cause of child welfare, aspiring to be the bedrock for mobilizing and allocating resources in support of endeavors that resonate with the mission and vision of PPS.

The foundation will primarily be involved in supporting PPS advocacy programs, education, research and community projects. It shall provide assistance in implementing support programs for children with special needs, nutrition and breastfeeding programs including the 1st 1000 days, undertakings

in dealing with emerging diseases, immunization campaigns, combatting against child abuse, teenage pregnancy prevention and other social or civic fraternal purposes, in accordance with the PPS mission and vision and strictly in compliance with SEC regulations.

X. Strengthening Bonds and Cultivating Unity: 12-Chapter Visits Initiative and Engagement

Driven by a mutual dedication to foster collaboration and camaraderie, the officers and members of the National BOT undertook visits to all 12 chapters of the Philippine Pediatric Society. These engagements offered invaluable chances to directly interact with our esteemed members, enabling open dialogue and the exchange of updates on society initiatives. I extend my heartfelt appreciation for the gracious hospitality extended by each chapter. These visits have not only strengthened our bonds as a society but have also reaffirmed and united our shared commitment to advancing pediatric healthcare in the Philippines.

XI. Philippine Pediatric Society's Digital Overhaul: A Key Triumph of Our Tenure

The Philippine Pediatric Society's transition into a digitally advanced entity is the zenith of our accomplishments during this term. This monumental achievement is a collective victory, embodying our esteemed members' concerted efforts and visionary perspectives. With her innovative vision, Dr. Elizabeth Tan was instrumental in steering us toward seamless digital integration, meticulously orchestrating this evolution in phases. Dr. Tan's insightful suggestion to enlist Mr. Jamie Dy, our IT consultant, for his indispensable technical prowess and counsel was pivotal in ensuring the fluidity of our digital metamorphosis.

With the unwavering support of the NBOT, we set forth a mission to amplify our society's digital presence and operational prowess. This endeavor led to the rollout of pivotal initiatives in stages, establishing significant landmarks in the history of PPS, including:

Unified Digital Ecosystem: Under the expert guidance of Mr. Jamie Francis Dy, our ICT consultant, the Philippine Pediatric Society Inc. has reached a significant milestone by consolidating all online services into a singular, intuitive platform. This consolidation facilitates easier access for our members and heralds considerable financial savings, marking a substantial stride toward cost efficiency and operational excellence for society.

Financial Prudence: Our migration to Amazon Web Services (AWS) to host our main website, e-learning platforms, CPD online, trainee programs, and email services represented a significant pivot in our fiscal strategy. Previously burdened with annual operational costs of around P4,680,000, this strategic shift to AWS curtailed our expenses to an estimated P200,000 annually. This drastic adjustment led to a remarkable 96% reduction in operational expenses over two years, translating to savings of about P8,960,000. This pivotal move significantly reduced our expenses and enabled us to divert more resources toward enhancing member services and bolstering pediatric care initiatives.

Cost-Effective Portal Development

In developing the new PPS portal, we employed a team of freelancers instead of incurring potentially exorbitant costs with large firms. This decision allowed us to meet our organizational needs while retaining complete control over the source code, sidestepping the constraints and licensing dilemmas often associated with big corporations. This approach resulted in substantial cost savings, achieving an estimated 88% expense reduction.

Empowering Members and Partners

Our digital transformation has revolutionized our internal operations and simplified access to updates and guidelines for our members, partners, and stakeholders. This initiative has unlocked new levels of engagement and accessibility, empowering our valued members and partners to fully leverage our society's comprehensive resources and offerings.

I am grateful for the support and collaboration of the Child Health and Informatics Committee (CHIC) Team in these digital transformation endeavors.

XII. Charting the Digital Frontier: A Testament to Vision and Collaboration

This accomplishment is a testament to the 2022-2024 NBOT's vision and resolve; driven by our shared aspiration to achieve operational excellence, efficiency, self-reliance, fiscal integrity and accountability.



- d. Issues and Concerns Relative to the Foreign Medical Professional (FMP) Under Medical Residency and Fellowship Training Program in the Philippines on 11 October 2023
- Submit names of the FMPs who passed the certifying examinations annually – PPS Secretary to prepare list and annually thereafter.
 - Malpractice of profession, misconduct, and other legal cases -> hospital must notify PPS and PPS must inform PRC (because of the easier communication between the societies and PRC) – HAB secretary to disseminate.
 - Grounds for disqualification or loss of accreditation of training institutions, aside from statutory requirements, is up to each society – HAB secretary to submit.
 - Maximum of 2 months pre-residency / pre-fellowship – HAB secretary to disseminate.
 - Submit table of specifications (test blueprint) of certifying examinations – SB secretary to submit.
 - PPS allows FMPs to take the PPS exams and issues a certificate of passing but does not bestow the title of diplomate. If an FMP is given a license to practice in the PH, is PPS willing to give the title of diplomate (certificate of specialization)? – SB to decide.




Fig.1 Percentage of Monthly Newborn Discharges Submission from January 2021 to December 2023




Fig. 2 Percentage of Monthly Ward Discharges Submission from January 2015 December 2023

CODE OF ETHICS OF THE PHILIPPINE PEDIATRIC SOCIETY, INC.

The Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc. (PPS), cognizant of its role of ensuring the rights of every child to a healthy and meaningful life, hereby promulgates the PPS Code of Ethics by which every PPS member should faithfully abide by. Fundamental to this Code is the recognition that a child is a unique individual who undergoes different stages of growth and development. Pediatricians as child advocates shall assure quality care to the best interest of the child. As a duly recognized member, the PPS shall abide by the Philippine Medical Association (PMA) Code of Ethics.

Definition of Terms for Purpose of the PPS Code of Ethics

- A. Adolescence – encompasses ages 10-19 years (per WHO and DOH)
- B. Minor – a person who has not reached the age of majority, which by legal definition, is someone who is below 18 years of age (RA No. 6809)
- C. Allied health care professional – a person, not a physician, working in a component of such health care system, whether professional or non-professional, including volunteer workers, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, therapists, technicians, assistants, and community volunteers.
- D. Child – refers to the newborn, infant, child, and adolescent
- E. Colleagues – refer to other physicians
- F. Pediatrician – refers to member of Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc.
- G. Trainees – refers to residents and fellows in training
- H. Health care industry – means governmental, non-governmental or private institutions or organizations engaged directly or indirectly in health care
- I. Health facility – means health care systems including but not limited to barangay health stations, health centers, clinics, and hospitals
- J. Patient – refers to the child who is the recipient of health care, the parent, or legal guardian who have legal rights over their children
- K. Promotional giveaways or gifts – refers to any form of marketing materials, incentives provided directly or indirectly by manufacturers, distributors and their representatives, of their products

- L. Sponsorship – refers to companies and their agents / representatives hosting, initiating or otherwise providing support for conventions, meetings, sports or cultural events, fellowship training, charities, and other like activities for the purpose of promoting directly or indirectly, their products
- M. Telemedicine – refers to the practice of medicine by means of electronic and telecommunication technologies such as phone call, chat or short messaging service (SMS), audio- and video-conferencing, among others, to deliver healthcare at a distance between a patient at an originating site, and a physician at a distant site. *(Adapted from DOH-UP Manila Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2020-0001)*

General Principles

1. A pediatrician shall provide competent medical care in accordance with the current standards of care and maintain honesty, integrity, compassion, and respect for human dignity.
2. The patient has the right to choose a pediatrician. A pediatrician shall be free to choose his patient, except in emergencies.
3. A voluntary informed consent when necessary shall be obtained from the parent / legal guardian who has the moral and legal right to decide for the child. This includes the right to refuse diagnostic and/or therapeutic procedures at any time without prejudice to ongoing or future treatment.
4. A pediatrician shall respect the privacy of patients including confidentiality of patient information even after death.
5. A pediatrician shall observe judicious use of social media including awareness of the benefits and pit falls of such in pediatric care.
6. The relationship between a pediatrician and other members of the health care team shall be one of mutual respect and cooperation with the common goal of preserving the health and well-being of the child and noble image of the profession.
7. A pediatrician shall observe proper protocol when seeking consultation from a sub-specialist or other allied health care professionals with the consent of the patient.
8. Pediatricians have a responsibility to use their expertise and influence to advocate for children and their interests in all spheres of community life, not just in health care.
9. A pediatrician shall always promote and protect the dignity, integrity and nobility of the profession in interacting with the health care industry and the community at large.

10. A pediatrician shall conduct himself in a professional manner worthy of emulation by his students, trainees, allied health care providers and colleagues.
11. The best interest of the child shall be the primary consideration when doing research involving children, and must conform to the generally accepted scientific principles and good clinical practice.

**ARTICLE I
PEDIATRICIAN-PATIENT RELATIONSHIP**

Section 1. General Considerations

1.1. Informed Consent

- 1.1.1. The attending pediatrician shall obtain the informed consent. In the event that he delegates this task and the documentation of such to another health care provider, he remains fully responsible.
- 1.1.2. The pediatrician shall present sufficient information to allow the patient to make a voluntary decision regarding a treatment or procedure. The elements necessary for a sufficient information include the following:
 - 1.1.2.1. Diagnosis / working diagnosis
 - 1.1.2.2. Purpose and description of proposed treatment / procedure
 - 1.1.2.3. Risks and benefits of proposed treatment / procedure
 - 1.1.2.4. Alternatives to the proposed treatment / procedure
- 1.1.3. In a life -threatening emergency, no informed consent is necessary. Provided that there is no risk to the pediatrician, he shall administer initial treatment. Once stabilized, the patient shall be referred to the primary physician or a competent health care provider and / or appropriate health facility.

1.2. Professional Fees

The pediatrician shall consider the patient's capacity to pay the professional fees which shall be commensurate to the services rendered.

- 1.3. The pediatrician shall respect the expressed request of parents of in-patients to seek second opinion.
- 1.4. In case the pediatrician or the parent / guardian terminates the doctor-patient relationship, the attending pediatrician shall ensure continuity of care until proper endorsement is made.

Section 2. Antenatal Diagnosis and Genetic Counselling

- 2.1. The pediatrician, in coordination with the obstetrician, shall inform the parents of the antenatal diagnosis and probable prognosis of a congenital anomaly. Under no circumstances shall termination of pregnancy / therapeutic abortion be considered.
- 2.2. The pediatrician shall always offer genetic counselling to parents who had children born with genetic defect or congenital malformation.

Section 3. Neonatal Care

- 3.1. Competent basic resuscitation shall be made available to all newly born infants.
- 3.2. Initiation of resuscitation in the delivery room of newborns with confirmed gestational age of < 23 weeks and / or < 400 grams birth weight is not obligatory.
- 3.3. The decision on the subsequent management shall depend upon the assessment of the following issues: viability, co-morbid conditions, confirmed lethal anomalies, chances of survival, availability of health care resources, and risks of mortality and morbidity. These shall be discussed with the parents and / or legal guardian during a properly documented family conference. The decisions reached shall be relayed to all concerned health care providers.

Section 4. Adolescent Care

- 4.1. Parents have legal rights over their minor children.
- 4.2. Confidentiality of care should be applied in the interview of any adolescent.
 - 4.2.1. Parents should be advised of the reasons why the adolescent must be given time alone with the physician.
 - 4.2.2. Parents and patient must be informed that any information revealed in confidence to the physician must be respected as private communication between patient and physician except in the following cases:
 - 4.2.2.1. When the patient is suicidal or wants to hurt himself
 - 4.2.2.2. When the patient is homicidal or wants to hurt others
 - 4.2.2.3. When the patient is a victim of any form of abuse
- 4.3. The pediatrician shall explain to the patient that family support is vital in such cases as reproductive health issues, substance abuse, suicide, and other situations that may need support.
- 4.4. During the physical examination of the adolescent, a physician should request the presence of a third person of the adolescent's choice.

Section 5. Child Abuse and Neglect

By law, the attending pediatrician shall report any case of suspected child abuse or neglect to the nearest Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), police authority, National Bureau of Investigation (NBI), or Child Protection Unit (CPU).

ARTICLE II PEDIATRICIAN-COLLEAGUES AND ALLIED HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS RELATIONSHIP

Section 1. The conduct of a pediatrician shall be above board in relation to colleagues and allied health care professionals. The pediatrician should strive to protect the good name of his colleagues. Concerns about professional conduct of colleagues, trainees, and other health care professionals shall be directed first to persons themselves and then to responsible authorities. Improper / unbecoming conduct such as verbal or physical abuse to subordinates and other members of the health team shall not be tolerated as it undermines the dignity of the person and effectiveness of patient care.

Section 2. The pediatrician shall work with allied health care professionals as part of a team.

Section 3. A pediatrician shall observe proper protocol in the referral system.

- 3.1. The attending pediatrician shall specify if the referral is for opinion / evaluation, co-management, or transfer of service.
- 3.2. If the patient is referred as such, the consultant shall communicate his findings and recommendations to the attending pediatrician verbally or in writing.
- 3.3. The patient shall be returned to the care of the primary pediatrician for continuity of care when the reason for the referral has been resolved.

Section 4. In case of conflict of decisions or in difficult situations, the pediatrician shall refer to a third party or the Hospital Committee on Ethics.

Section 5. In the event that the attending pediatrician is unavailable, coverage by another certified pediatrician shall be arranged with the consent of the parent / guardian. The patient shall be returned to the care of the attending pediatrician as soon as he becomes available.

Section 6. The pediatrician shall not give nor receive remuneration of any kind for referrals or procedures done on patients.

Section 7. The pediatrician shall waive professional fees on the immediate dependents of colleagues.

**ARTICLE III
PEDIATRICIAN-COMMUNITY RELATIONSHIP**

Section 1. Pediatricians, as advocates for the welfare of children, shall get involved and cooperate in health information to laymen and civic organizations.

Section 2. Pediatricians shall volunteer services to victims of epidemics and calamities.

Section 3. As child advocates pediatricians have ethical obligations to give honest, objective and accurate information whenever called upon as expert witnesses / amicus curae.

**ARTICLE IV
PEDIATRICIAN-HEALTH CARE INDUSTRY RELATIONSHIP**

Section 1. Continuing Professional Development

- 1.1. The PPS shall organize CPD conferences and meetings, which shall contribute to improve and optimize care of the child.
- 1.2. The PPS General guidelines for industry-sponsored CPD activities shall be followed.
- 1.3. The PPS may accept subsidies to defray expenses for the events.
- 1.4. Pediatricians shall use only generic names of drugs in CPD activities.
- 1.5. Scholarships for trainees in pediatrics and its subspecialties are permissible as long as the organizers or academic institutions concerned make the selection of scholar.
- 1.6. Pediatricians may accept reasonable subsidies from health and other industries to support their participation in CPD events (per Code of Ethics of the Medical Profession formerly PMA, 2016).
- 1.7. Pediatricians invited as speakers, moderators, rapporteurs, or any other active role in the scientific program may accept honoraria and reimbursements for reasonable travel, lodging, and meal expenses.
- 1.8. When commercial exhibits are part of a CPD activity, arrangements for these shall not influence the planning of nor interfere with the CPD activities. Only relevant information of the product shall be included in the exhibit area.

Section 2. Endorsements

- 2.1. A pediatrician shall not be allowed to endorse products/devices, medical or otherwise, for commercial purposes in quadri-media.
- 2.2. A pediatrician shall not receive financial or any form of benefits / gifts in exchange for prescriptions and/or partnering with diagnostic and / or therapeutic facilities.

Section 3. Promotional Giveaways

The members of PPS may accept only promotional giveaways and /or gifts of reasonable value that are related to their work / clinical practice.

ARTICLE V ETHICS IN RESEARCH INVOLVING CHILDREN

Section 1. General Principles

- 1.1. The main ethical challenge of pediatric research is the need to balance protection of children from research risk against ethical considerations of conducting research to improve the lives of future children. The risks should be minimized and balanced against any anticipated benefits to the subjects. The fact that some children derive a direct benefit from participation in research must also be considered, making it important to distinguish research with the prospect of direct benefit from nontherapeutic pediatric research.
- 1.2. Since children are a vulnerable population, there are restrictions on the research risks to which a child may be exposed. These restrictions function by limiting the kind of research Institutional Review Board (IRB) are permitted to approve and by specifying the conditions under which parent(s)/legal guardian(s) have the moral and legal authority to permit a child to participate in research.

Section 2. Nontherapeutic research in children is ethically controversial and preferably should never be used unless the anticipated knowledge is of vital importance for understanding a child's disorder or condition.

Section 3. The welfare of an individual child must always come first before the scientific goals of the research study.

Section 4. Only scientifically and clinically competent physicians with integrity who possess good clinical practice training certificate shall conduct biomedical research involving children.

Section 5. Contents of the informed consent shall comply with the basic principles of the World Medical Association Declaration of Helsinki adopted June, 1964. The standard for informed consent in pediatric research shall be set higher than that of adult subjects

All researches involving children shall have informed consent.

5.1. Participants from birth to 18 years of age shall need consent of the legal guardian (order of authority – parents, surviving parent, grandparents, surviving grandparents, eldest surviving sibling above 21 years of age, and guardian).

5.2. In addition to the informed consent, assent of the child between 7years to < 18 years shall be obtained without coercion depending on the extent of his developmental capabilities. Any sign of dissent by the child must be respected and documented.

Section 6. All researches on children should have a technical and ethical review board approval.

Section 7. Privacy and confidentiality of the participants shall be maintained at all times.

Section 8. Compensation to participants shall be fair, neither exploitive nor coercive.

Section 9. Stem cell research involving aborted fetuses and pre-implantation embryos are unacceptable.

ARTICLE VI ETHICS IN THE USE OF TELEMEDICINE IN PEDIATRIC PRACTICE

Section 1. Rationale

Children belong to a special segment of the population that requires considerable attention during telehealth consults. They are still growing and developing and have characteristic peculiarities at certain ages. Therefore, some services should be adopted appropriate for the children based on the following factors: physical, legal, communication or data gathering, developmental stage, unique pediatric conditions and age specific peculiarities in both normal and disease states.

Section 2. Ethical Principles Relevant to Telemedicine

Telemedicine shall be guided by the bioethical principles that are relevant to telemedicine such as autonomy, confidentiality, justice, beneficence, and non-maleficence.

Section 3. Objectives

The objective of this guideline is to ensure effective, safe delivery of quality health care and ethical practice of telemedicine in Pediatrics.

Section 4. Requirements of the Practice of Telemedicine

4.1. Webside Manners During a Telemedicine Consultation (*Source: DOH-UP Manila Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2020-0001*)

4.1.1. Greetings

- 4.1.1.1. Introduce self and your role. Ask patient to introduce himself and family members or other companions in the room, if assisted.
- 4.1.1.2. Confirm with patient that he can see and hear you clearly.
- 4.1.1.3. Acknowledge the use of the new technology. Normalize any discomfort with the use of the platform.
- 4.1.1.4. Demonstrate confidence in the technology and reason for use. Include instructions on what to do in case of disconnection

4.1.2. Maintaining Etiquette

- 4.1.2.1. Be aware of one's actions since these will be magnified on camera. Sit fully upright in an appropriate attire.
- 4.1.2.2. Do not fidget, scratch, play with your hair or touch your face.
- 4.1.2.3. Disable picture in picture function.
- 4.1.2.4. Look directly at the camera. This can be perceived by the patient as making eye contact.
- 4.1.2.5. Position video window of patient's image at the top of your screen below the webcam.
- 4.1.2.6. Explain and narrate all your actions.

4.1.3. Empathy and Communication

- 4.1.3.1. Speak slowly and clearly. Pause longer between statements to allow for transmission delay.
- 4.1.3.2. Type into the chat window to reiterate instructions or next steps.
- 4.1.3.3. Check in frequently to elicit reactions and confirm understanding.
- 4.1.3.4. Use non-verbal cues even on virtual visits. Smile often. Use a warm tone of voice.

- 4.1.3.5. Increase the frequency of empathetic statements to show that you are listening.
- 4.1.3.6. Inform the patient when occupied such as when writing notes or looking at radiologic images or laboratory results.
- 4.1.3.7. Summarize and clarify questions in case of delay or signal interference.
- 4.1.3.8. In case of disconnection during video consultations, inform the patient how to continue the consultation.

4.2. Informed Consent

- 4.2.1. Proper informed consent must be obtained prior to the collection of personal data and the teleconsultation regardless if it is an initial consultation or a follow up consultation. Consent shall be evidenced by written, electronic or recorded means. *(Adapted from DOH-UP Manila Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2020-0001 and Data Privacy Act 2012)*
- 4.2.2. Obtaining the informed consent shall be guided by the same principles as specified in the PPS Code of Ethics Article I Section 1.
- 4.2.3. The existing principles of the data privacy act (Data Privacy Act 2012 Section 3.B) and the PPS Code of Ethics statement regarding privacy (General Principles) shall guide in obtaining the informed consent.
- 4.2.4. The informed consent should include the following data: purpose, participants, scope and limitation, nature of teleconsultation, medical information and records, confidentiality, rights, risks and consequences, benefits, and consent.
- 4.2.5. The informed consent should include this waiver: that the teleconsultation has its limitations and the Pediatrician should exercise professional judgement whether a face to face consultation is required.

4.3. History Taking

History taking shall be done in the conventional way of listening to the chief complaint, taking of the history of the patient's illness, review of systems, birth and maternal history, nutritional history, developmental and psychosocial history, past medical history, immunizations, family history, medications, and other relevant information which may aid in the diagnosis of the patient's condition.

4.4. Physical Examination

- 4.4.1. Information gathered in a traditional way of doing a face-to-face physical examination shall as much as possible be gathered through on-line 'physical examination' of the patient with the help of the parent or guardian.
- 4.4.2. A parent or guardian should be present to assist the Pediatrician in performing the physical examination and in obtaining anthropometric measurements and vital signs.
- 4.4.3. During the physical examination of an adolescent, the Pediatrician should request the presence of a third person of the adolescent's choice.

4.5. Laboratory and Other Ancillary Procedures

- 4.5.1. Except in extraordinary situations, results of laboratory and diagnostic procedures must be viewed directly on the monitor by the Pediatrician and must not rely solely on the reading of another person on the other side of the virtual room. In case of doubt, the Pediatrician must consult the signatory of the report for confirmation of the result.
- 4.5.2. In addition to the actual physical examination, the Pediatrician may request for the necessary diagnostic and ancillary procedures to aid him or her in the diagnosis and as a guide for the treatment of the patient's illness.

Section 5. Practice of Telemedicine by Telephone

Telephone calls and text messaging are generally discouraged. It is up to the physician's discretion to entertain such when the situation is deemed urgent. This consult shall be duly recorded. An immediate consult at the Emergency Room or a face-to-face consult at the earliest possible time is then routinely advised.

Section 6. Professional Fees

Professional fees should be commensurate to the services rendered with due consideration to the patient's financial status, nature of the case, time consumed and the professional standing and skill of the physician in the community. The patient shall be informed ahead of time of the cost of the consultation. *(adapted from the PMA Code of Ethics Article II Section 7)*

Section 7. Electronic Prescription

Online prescription of medicines shall be allowed. The Pediatrician shall ensure that, before his electronic signature is affixed, the prescription complies with basic principles of prescription order writing. Regulated drugs are prescribed as mandated by existing laws.

Section 8. Peddling and Advertisements

- 8.1. The Pediatrician shall be guided by Article IV of the PPS Code of Ethics in his relationship with the healthcare industry. All members of the PPS who are invited to participate in any platform or fora should assume personal responsibility in clearly defining the purpose of his participation and to avoid inadvertent endorsement of any product.
- 8.2. All members shall abide by the PMA guidelines for doctors in advertising, peddling, posting services, and / or products. What the pediatrician can post is limited only to his name, profession, clinic address, and contact number.

Section 9. Pediatrician-Healthcare Industry Relationship

The pediatrician shall comply with the guidelines of Pediatrician- Healthcare Industry Relationship under Article IV of the PPS Code of Ethics.

**ELECTION CODE OF THE
PHILIPPINE PEDIATRIC SOCIETY, INC.**

**ARTICLE I
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Section 1. Name

This code shall be known as the Election Code of the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc.

Section 2. Declaration of Basic Principles

- 2.1. Suffrage is a basic right. Its sanctity is the responsibility of all the regular members of good standing of the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc.
- 2.2. Election to a position is an honor and a privilege. The position seeks the man and not the man seeking the position.

Section 3. Implementing Body

This code shall be implemented by an independent body known as the Committee on Election which shall have full powers to implement all matters pertaining to the election. The decisions and actions of the Committee on Elections shall be final.

Section 4. Effectivity

This Code shall govern the conduct of all elections of the Philippine Pediatric Society after April 18, 2010.

**ARTICLE II
THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTION**

Section 1. Composition and Tenure

The Committee on Election is an independent body with the sole authority to manage and conduct all elections of the PPS.

- 1.1. The Committee on Election shall be composed of one chair and 4 members to be appointed by the Board of Trustees.
- 1.2. The term of office shall be on a staggered appointment of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 year/s respectively, as determined by the Board of Trustees.

- 1.3. Any vacancy in the committee shall be filled by the Board of Trustees within 30 days to complete the unexpired term.

Section 2. Duties and Responsibilities

- 2.1. Enforce the rules and regulations contained in the Election Code
- 2.2. Decide on all election protests and violations
- 2.3. Impose necessary sanctions, after due process
- 2.4. Appoint deputies to police the conduct of the election
- 2.5. Postpone, suspend and cancel the election when deemed necessary
- 2.6. Supervise and police pre-election activities of candidates
- 2.7. Provide paraphernalia for the election
- 2.8. Conduct the entire election proceedings on Election Day
- 2.9. Require the PPS Secretary to submit the list of qualified voters before the Election Day
- 2.10. Supervise the election of the PPS Officers and announce the winners

Section 3. Meetings

The Committee on Election shall meet within two (2) weeks after the deadline for nominations set by the Nomination Committee, to discuss and plan the election process.

Section 4. Quorum

A majority of the members constitute a quorum, and a majority of the members constituting the quorum can act and approve all other matters pertaining to the election.

Section 5. Removal from the Committee

Any member of the committee may be removed from office by the Board of Trustees for:

- 5.1. Incapacity or failure to serve as provided for in Article II Section II.
- 5.2. Acceptance of nomination as a candidate for any PPS elective position.

ARTICLE III THE CANDIDATE

Section 1. Qualifications

The Candidate shall have the following qualifications:

- 1.1. Filipino citizen
- 1.2. Resident of the Philippines for the last five (5) years
- 1.3. Good moral character
- 1.4. Fellow in good standing for the last five consecutive years prior to his/her candidacy.

Section 2. Requirements

- 2.1. Duly accomplished candidate's data sheet (PPS Committee on Election Form 1)
- 2.2. Candidate's signed statement of conformity (PPS Committee on Election Form 2)
- 2.3. Certificate from the PPS Secretary that the candidate is a Fellow in good standing for past five consecutive years (PPS Committee on Election Form 3)
- 2.4. Three (3) passport size colored pictures with white background taken within the last 6 months with name at the bottom
- 2.5. Recommend a regular PPS member of good standing as official canvassing watcher

Section 3. Statement of Conformity

All candidates shall sign a statement agreeing to conform with all the rules and regulations of the PPS and those of the Election Code with attached Duties and Responsibilities. An elected member of the Board of Trustees shall attend all of the Regular and Special BOT Meetings, Annual Business Meeting, and other official PPS activities, unless excused for valid reasons.

**ARTICLE IV
THE VOTERS**

Section 1. Qualifications

- 1.1. Only regular PPS members in good standing are qualified to vote in person.
- 1.2. They must be registered by 12 noon of the first day of the Scientific Activities of the Annual Convention

**ARTICLE V
PROHIBITED ACTS, PRACTICES AND PENALTIES**

Section 1. Electioneering / Prohibited Acts

Electioneering by candidates and voters is prohibited. The Committee on Election has the authority to determine what constitutes electioneering.

Section 2. Acts That Constitute Electioneering

The following actions are specifically prohibited from the time the certificate of candidacy has been filed:

- 2.1. Donations in cash or in kind to Chapters, Subspecialty Societies, and other PPS-related entities for sports, projects, etc.
- 2.2. Influencing a member to vote for him by acts such as payment of dues, giving food and drinks and other goods, providing entertainment, and hotel accommodations
- 2.3. Formation of tickets, slates, or parties
- 2.4. Traveling on the pretext of conducting seminars, symposia, and other similar events outside those officially sanctioned by the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc.
- 2.5. Other acts identified by the Committee on Election as electioneering

Section 3. Penalties

- 3.1. Candidates found guilty of committing prohibited acts after due process, shall be disqualified from running for any office for a period of four years.
- 3.2. Voters found guilty of committing prohibited acts after due process, shall be subject to either censure or disfranchisement.

ARTICLE VI NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

Candidates may be the nominated by a Nomination Committee. In keeping with our basic policies, candidates are discouraged from actively seeking to be nominated.

Section 1. The Nomination Committee

- 1.1. The Nomination Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees. It shall be composed of 5 Fellows in good standing viz two (2) past presidents, one (1) from the Chapter, and two (2) Fellows in good standing from the general membership for a term of three years.
- 1.2. The members of the Nomination Committee are automatically disqualified from running as a candidate.
- 1.3. The Nomination Committee shall screen the qualifications of the nominees.
- 1.4. The Nomination Committee shall seek and nominate at least eleven (11) Fellows qualified to serve as Trustees.
- 1.5. The Nomination Committee shall announce all the qualified candidates in the PPS Newsletter.

Section 2. The Candidate

- 2.1. Any two (2) members in good standing may nominate a candidate for Trustees in writing with the consent of the nominee.
- 2.2. The nominee shall complete the requirements and submit the same to the Nomination Committee for screening on or before 12:00 noon of February 15 of each year.

Section 3. Grounds for Disqualification

- 3.1. Any member who has been found to have violated the PPS / PMA Codes of Ethics or found guilty of electioneering after due process, shall be ineligible to run for office.
- 3.2. Failure of a candidate for reelection to comply with the duties and responsibilities as stipulated by the Constitution and By-Laws of the Society shall be disqualified to be nominated, after due process.

Section 4. Announcement of Candidates

- 4.1. The list of candidates shall be announced by the Nomination Committee not later than February 28 of each year.

- 4.2. The Nomination Committee shall prepare the approved list of candidates and circularized to all members through the PPS Website / PPS Newsletter. The decision on the format and contents shall be the exclusive right of the Nomination Committee.

ARTICLE VII THE ELECTION

Section 1. Date and Place

The election shall be held on the second day of the Scientific Activities of the Annual Convention. The voting hours shall be from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM at the designated place by the Committee on Election.

Section 2. Voters List

The Committee on Election shall receive the list of qualified voters from the PPS Secretary the day before the Election Day.

Section 3. Election Paraphernalia

The Committee on Election shall prepare all materials necessary for the computerized election such as the signages, stub boxes, list of candidates, and voting booths.

Section 4. Manner of Voting

- 4.1. Proxy voting shall not be allowed.
- 4.2. The voting process shall start by placing the voter's ID No. in the space provided for in the computerized election program.
- 4.3. The voters shall be required to vote for eleven (11) trustees viz eight (8) members from candidates at large and three (3) members representing Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.
- 4.4. Choose and vote by clicking the name of the candidate listed in alphabetical order.
- 4.5. Check if the summary page contains 11 votes to be accepted and deemed valid.
- 4.6. To end, click the "submit ballot" button on the screen and log out.
- 4.7. A special booth shall be provided for the Past Presidents, Emeritus Fellows, PPS Members aged 65 years old and above, and PPS members with disability.

Section 5. Canvassing of Votes

- 5.1. The canvassing of votes shall be done in public immediately after voting ends at 3:00 PM.
- 5.2. All candidates or their representative shall be present for the canvassing.
- 5.3. The Chair of the Committee on Election shall execute the tallying of the computer output.
- 5.4. The Chair and the members of the Committee on Election shall affix their signatures on the official tally sheet after the votes have been counted.

Section 6. Proclamation of the Board of Trustees and Election of Officers

- 6.1. A written proclamation shall be made by the Committee on Election immediately after canvassing, provided there are no protests officially filed with the Committee. In case of a tie, the winner shall be determined by lot under the supervision of the Committee.
- 6.2. Election of Officers
 - 6.2.1. All winning candidates for the Board of Trustees (BOT) shall be present during the election of officers.
 - 6.2.2. The election of officers shall start after the written proclamation by the Committee on Election at 3:00 PM on Election Day. The Chairman of the Committee on Election shall conduct the election of officers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer) by secret ballot, immediately after the canvassing at 3:00 PM unless otherwise postponed upon request by the majority of the elected Trustees.
 - 6.2.3. Candidates for officers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer) shall have served the Board for at least four (4) consecutive years.
 - 6.2.4. No tickets or line-ups are allowed. Nominations for particular positions are not required and the election shall be conducted by a series of eliminations, considering all Trustees are qualified as candidates for each position. Majority votes are required to be elected.
 - 6.2.5. In case of failure to elect, postponement is in order provided it shall be held within one week after the Annual Election and Convention.

Section 7. Election Protest

- 7.1. Any qualified PPS member in good standing or candidate for BOT position may file a protest immediately after canvassing of votes.
- 7.2. The Committee on Election shall sit en banc during the entire proceedings regarding any election protest.
- 7.3. A majority vote of at least three (3) is needed to decide on all election protests.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this Code shall be done as deemed necessary by the Board of Trustees.

AMENDED BY-LAWS
OF
PHILIPPINE PEDIATRIC SOCIETY, INC.

ARTICLE I

MEETINGS

Section 1. Annual Meetings – The annual meetings of the members shall be held at the principal office of the association on April of each year. The President shall render his annual report to the members regarding the activities of the association. The election of directors shall also be held during the annual meeting.

Section 2. Special Meetings – Special meetings of the members shall be called as the need thereof arises, by the Board of Trustees of the President or upon petition of 1/3 of the general membership.

Section 3. Notices - Notices of the time and place of annual, and special meetings of the members shall be given either personally or by special delivery mail, at least two (2) weeks before the date set for such meeting. The notice of every special meeting shall state briefly the purpose of the meeting.

Section 4. Quorum – A quorum for any meeting of the members shall consist of a majority of the members and a majority of such quorum may decide any question at the meeting, except those matters where the Corporation Code requires the affirmative vote of a greater proportion.

Section 5. Order of Business – The order of business at the annual meeting of the members shall be as follows.

- a. Proof of service of the required notice of the meeting.
- b. Proof of the presence of a quorum.
- c. Reading and approval of the minutes of the previous annual meeting.
- d. Unfinished business.
- e. Report of the President.
- f. Election of the Trustees for the ensuing year.
- g. Other matters.

Section 6. Voting Proxy – Each member shall be entitled to one vote, and he may vote either in person or by proxy which shall be in writing and filed with the Secretary of the association before the scheduled meeting.

ARTICLE II

TRUSTEES

Section 1. Board of Trustees – The corporate powers of the association shall be exercised, its business conducted and its property controlled by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Qualifications – The trustees to be elected must be of legal age and members of the association **in good standing as defined in Section 4 of Article V hereof. (as amended on April 5, 2016)**

Section 3. Disqualification of Trustees or Officers – No member convicted by final judgment of an offense punishable by imprisonment for a period exceeding six (6) years, or a violation of the Corporation Code of the Philippines committed within five (5) years prior to the date of his election or appointment, shall qualify as a trustee or officer.

Section 4. Term of Office of Trustees – The trustees shall hold office **for two (2) years** and until their successors are duly elected and qualified. **(as amended on April 5, 2016)**

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers – The officers of the association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. They shall be elected by the Board of Trustees from among themselves. The Board may combine compatible offices in a single person.

Section 2. Term of Office of Officers – All officers of the association shall hold office **for two (2) years** and until their successors are duly elected and qualified. **(as amended on April 5, 2016)**

ARTICLE IV

FUNCTIONS & POWERS OF OFFICERS

Section 1. President – The President shall be the Chief Executive of the association. He shall preside at all meetings of the members of the association and the Board of Trustees.

He shall execute all resolutions of the Board of Trustees. He shall be charged with directing and overseeing the activities of the association. He shall submit to the Board as soon as possible after the close of each fiscal year, and to the members of each annual meeting, a complete report of the activities and operations of the association for the fiscal year under his term.

Section 2. Vice President – The Vice President, if qualified, shall exercise all powers and perform all duties of the President during the absence or incapacity of the latter and shall perform duties that may be assigned by the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Secretary – The Secretary shall give all notices required by these by-laws and keep the minutes of all meetings of the members and of the Board of Trustees in a book kept for the purpose. He shall keep the seal of the association and affix such seal to any paper or instrument requiring the same. He shall have custody of the members register and the correspondence files of the association. He shall also perform all such other duties and work as the Board of Trustees may from time to time assign to him.

Section 4. Treasurer – The Treasurer shall have charge of the funds, receipts and disbursements of the association. He shall keep all moneys and other valuables of the association in such banks as the Board of Trustees may designate. He shall keep and have charge of the books of accounts. He shall also perform such other duties and functions as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Board of Trustees. He shall post a bond in such amount as may be fixed by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE V

MEMBERS

Section 1. Qualifications for Membership – The board shall determine the qualifications of an applicant for membership.

Section 2. Rights of Members – A member shall have the following rights:

- a. To exercise the right to vote on all matters relating to the affairs of the association;
- b. To be eligible to any elective or appointive office of the association;
- c. To participate in all deliberations/meetings of the association;
- d. To avail of all the facilities of the association;
- e. To examine all the records or books of the association during business hours.

Section 3. Duties and Responsibilities of the Members – A member shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. To obey and comply with the by-laws, rules and regulations that may be promulgated by the association from time to time;
- b. To attend all meetings of the association;
- c. To pay membership dues and other assessments of the association.

Section 4. Members in Good Standing - A member in good standing is one who is without delinquent dues or assessments for at least six (6) months and not under suspension or disciplinary sanction by the association. Except in cases provided by law, a member not in good standing has no right to vote or be voted upon. (as amended on April 5, 2016)

ARTICLE VI

SUSPENSION, EXPULSION AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Suspension, expulsion and termination of membership, shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the association.

Any member of the association may file charges against a member by filing a written complaint with the Secretary of the association. The Board of Trustees shall call a special meeting to consider the charges. The affirmative vote of the majority of the trustees shall be necessary to suspend a member; Provided that where the penalty is expulsion, the affirmative vote of all the members of the association shall be necessary.

ARTICLE VII

FUND

Section 1. Funds – The funds of the association shall be derived from admission fees, annual dues, convention fees, and special assessments from members, gifts, or donations.

Section 2. Disbursements – Withdrawal from the funds of the association, whether by check or any other instrument, shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President. If necessary, the Board of Trustees may designate other signatories.

Section 3. Fiscal Year – The fiscal year of the association shall be from January 1st to December 31 of each year.

ARTICLE VIII

CORPORATE SEAL

Section 1. Form – The corporate seal of the association shall be in such form and design as may be determined by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE IX

AMENDMENTS OF THE BY-LAWS

Section 1. Amendments – These by-laws, or any provision thereof, may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the members and by a majority vote of the Trustees at any regular or special meeting duly held for the purpose.



**ARTICLE I
MEETINGS**

The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the association. He shall preside in all meetings of the members of the association and the board of trustees.

He shall execute all resolutions of the Board of Trustees. He shall be charged with directing and overseeing the activities of the association. He shall submit to the Board as soon as possible after the close of each fiscal year, and to the members of each annual meeting, a complete report of the activities and operations of the association for the fiscal year under his term.

Section 2. Vice-President

The Vice-President shall exercise all powers and perform all duties of the President during the absence or incapacity of the latter and shall perform duties that maybe assigned by the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Secretary

The Secretary shall give all notices required by these by-laws and keep the minutes of all meetings of the members and of the Board of Trustees in a book kept for the purpose. He shall keep the seal of the association and affix such seal to any paper or instrument requiring the same. He shall have custody of the members register and the correspondence files of the association. He shall also perform all such other duties and work as the Board of Trustees may from time to time assign to him.

Section 4. Treasurer

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MEMBERS**

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- B. To be eligible to any elective or appointive office of the association
- C. To participate in all deliberations / meetings of the association
- D. To avail of all the facilities of the association
- E. To examine all the records or books of the association during business hours

Section 3. Duties and Responsibilities of the Members

A member shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- A. To obey and comply with the by-laws, rules and regulations that may be promulgated by the association from time to time
- B. To attend all meetings of the association
- C. To pay membership dues and other assessments of the association

**ARTICLE VI
SUSPENSION, EXPULSION, AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP**

Suspension, expulsion and termination of membership, shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the association.

Any member of the association may file charges against a member by filing a written complaint with the Secretary of the association. The Board of Trustees shall call a special meeting to consider the charges. The affirmative vote of majority of all the trustees shall be necessary to suspend a member. Provided that where the penalty is expulsion, the affirmative vote of majority of all the members of the association shall be necessary.

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FUND**

Section 1. Funds

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Section 2. Disbursements

Withdrawal from the funds of the association, whether by check or any other instrument shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President. If necessary, the Board of Trustees may designate other signatories.

Section 3. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the association shall be from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

**ARTICLE IX
AMENDMENTS OF THE BY-LAWS**

Section 1. Amendments

These by-laws, or any provision thereof, may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the members and by a majority vote of the Trustees at any regular or special meeting duly held for the purpose.

Adopted this ___ day of _____, 20___, in _____ by the affirmative vote of the undersigned members representing a majority of the members of the association in a special meeting duly held for the purpose.

1. *If filed with Articles of Incorporation, these by-laws should be signed by all incorporators.*
2. *If filed after incorporation, it should be signed by a majority of the members and should submit Board of Trustees certificate for the adoption of the by-laws.*

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PHILIPPINE PEDIATRIC SOCIETY, INC.

To implement and supplement its Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws, the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc. hereby adopts and promulgates these rules to be known as THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PHILIPPINE PEDIATRIC SOCIETY, INC.

RULE 1 - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Qualifications

Membership in the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc. (PPS) shall be open to physicians licensed to practice in the Philippines after they have met all the requirements set by its Specialty Board (SB).

Members are classified as follows:

1.1. Regular

1.1.1. Diplomate

1.1.1.1. A graduate of medicine licensed to practice in the Philippines who has completed residency training in a PPS accredited hospital and has passed the written and oral SB examinations

1.1.1.2. A certified Fellow of an internationally recognized pediatric specialty board who is licensed to practice in the Philippines and has passed the oral SB examination.

1.1.2. Fellow – one who has three (3) years pediatric practice as a Diplomate of the Society plus a senior authorship of a prospective or retrospective research paper or one who has 6 years of pediatric practice as Diplomate in good standing

1.1.3. Emeritus Fellow – a Fellow who is at least sixty-five (65) years old and in good standing for the past fifteen (15) years.

1.1.4. Active and Associate Member – no new member shall be accepted in this category.

1.2. Special Categories

1.2.1. Honorary Fellow – a full professor of international prestige, a Fellow of an internationally recognized pediatric specialty board and has contributed to the

professional advancement of the PPS upon the recommendation of the SB and approval by the Board of Trustees (BOT).

- 1.2.2. Affiliate Fellow – a non-pediatrician who is a certified Fellow in good standing or its highest equivalent in a specialty and has at least two (2) years training in a specialty related to pediatrics, nominated by two (2) PPS Fellows and approved by the SB.
- 1.2.3. Non-Resident Diplomate – a foreign graduate without license to practice in the Philippines who has completed residency training in a PPS accredited hospital and certified as Diplomate by the SB.
- 1.2.4. Corresponding Member – a member who resides abroad and desires to continue his membership, provided annual dues are paid.

Section 2. Duties of Regular Members

- 2.1. Shall pay annual dues and other assessments not later than the first day of scientific activities of the annual convention.
- 2.2. Shall attend annual conventions including business meetings and register for the annual convention before noon of the first day of scientific activities to be able to vote.
- 2.3. Shall attend scientific meetings accredited by the Society with a minimum of twenty-five (25) Continuing Professional Development (CPD) units per year, at least 70% (15 CPD units) of which shall be from the PPS scientific meetings aside from the annual convention. Chapter members shall obtain 30% (10 CPD units) of these units from their own scientific meetings.
- 2.4. Shall report to the BOT any member violating any provision of the PPS, PMA, and PRC Code of Ethics of the medical profession
- 2.5. PPS chapter and cluster members shall attend their general assembly.

Section 3. Members of Good Standing

- 3.1. A member who fulfills the duties as stated in Rule 1, Section 2, is considered in good standing for 3 years. Failure to comply with these duties for three (3) consecutive years shall cause loss of membership after due process.
- 3.2. PPS chapter members who fail to attend annual regional business meetings for three (3) consecutive years shall lose membership after due process upon recommendation of the PPS chapter and approval of the PPS BOT.

Section 4. Leave of Absence

- 4.1. A member shall notify the Society in writing of his intent and duration of absence for at least a year and continue paying membership dues
- 4.2. If a member will apply for reclassification, there is still a need to present the required CPD units.

Section 5. Privileges of Members in Good Standing

- 5.1. Reduced annual convention fees
- 5.2. Right to vote and be voted upon in accordance with the Election Code
- 5.3. Certification as pediatric specialist upon request
- 5.4. Access to continuing professional development activities of the Society including international conferences
- 5.5. Avail of funds from the Society to conduct research
- 5.6. Free subscription to the PPS Journal of Pediatrics and newsletters
- 5.7. Use of the PPS Library including audiovisual facilities
- 5.8. Mutual aid benefits for members of good standing for the past ten (10) years for serious major illness, disability, and death benefits subject to the availability of funds.

RULE II – BOARD OF TRUSTEES (BOT)

Section 1. The BOT shall consist of eleven (11) Fellows who have been in good standing for the past 5 years, who shall be elected during the annual meeting of the Society in accordance with the Election Code of the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc. Three (3) of them shall each represent Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao, and shall be all Past Chapter Presidents chosen from their respective regions and shall serve for only one (1) term. Induction of the BOT shall be on the last day of the Annual Convention.

Section 2. The members of the BOT shall not receive any remuneration. The travel fare and accommodation of the chapter representatives to attend regular meetings and other official functions shall be reimbursed upon presentation of their corresponding receipts. Any member of BOT designated by the President in an official business shall be granted the same privileges.

Section 3. A majority of the total number of Trustees shall constitute a quorum to transact business and validly approve a corporate act within the competence of the said Board.

Section 4. Duties of the members of the BOT:

- 4.1. Attend the monthly Board meetings, special meetings called by the President and other PPS activities. Upon the request of at least three (3) members of the BOT, special meetings shall be called.
- 4.2. Approve a yearly program of activities of the Society
- 4.3. Approve upon recommendation of the President, the appointment of Council Directors, Chairs of Standing Committees and others not as yet provided for
- 4.4. Review, assess and approve activities, projects, and services
- 4.5. Monitor and evaluate PPS financed researches and publications
- 4.6. Approve the monthly financial report and the annual audited report of the Treasurer.
- 4.7. Approve the annual budget prepared by the treasurer
- 4.8. Recognize the decision of the Specialty Board, the certification, reclassification, and reinstatement of members upon submission by the SB
- 4.9. Decide on problems that may emanate from membership status or any relevant issue
- 4.10. Recognize accreditation of hospitals per submission by the HAB
- 4.11. Fill vacancies ad interim in any of the elective and appointive offices
- 4.12. Submit to the general membership an Annual Report, its business meeting proceedings and transactions including the financial report
- 4.13. Formulate positions on all issues involving the Society's objectives
- 4.14. Monitor and account for the properties of the Society
- 4.15. Additional duties of the chapter representatives
 - 4.15.1. Render regular report of chapter activities and concerns in their area of responsibility to the BOT as well as issues and concerns of the national organization to the chapters.
 - 4.15.2. Transmit and disseminate all business matters discussed in the Board to their chapters by conducting bi-monthly meetings with chapter officers.

- 4.15.3. Perform such other duties as may be assigned by the BOT.
- 4.15.4. Regularly consult the members of the chapter and reports vital issues to BOT during the regular meeting.

RULE III – NATIONAL OFFICERS

Section 1. The elected trustees immediately after their election shall meet and elect from among them the officers consisting of the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Upon the recommendation of the President, the BOT may appoint an Assistant Secretary and an Assistant Treasurer from among the Fellows of the Society.

Section 2. The officers and members of the BOT of the Society shall serve for a term of two (2) years until their successors shall have been elected and installed.

Section 3. Duties

3.1. The President shall preside at all general meetings of the Society and of the BOT and perform such other duties not specified in the By-Laws, as tradition and parliamentary usage require.

Serve as a spokesperson on behalf of the BOT.

3.2. The Vice-President shall perform the duties and functions ordinarily attached to his office. In the event a vacancy occurs in the Presidency due to physical incapacity, resignation, or death, the Vice-President assumes the Presidency. The Vice-President should oversee all activities related to CPD (Continuing Professional Development) and acts as a liaison officer with PhilHealth, PMA, PRC, DOH and other agencies where PPS as a society is involved.

3.3. The Secretary shall:

3.3.1. Record and keep all the minutes of the proceedings

3.3.2. Be custodian of all records and papers of the Society.

3.3.3. Render an annual report of all activities including the updated status of members.

3.3.4. Submit to the SEC updated reports: roster of officers, membership, amendments, and other reportorial requirements.

3.3.5. Oversee scientific meetings or delegate this to the Assistant Secretary

- 3.3.6. Issue the program of meetings as approved by the BOT.
- 3.3.7. Supervise the Secretariat
- 3.4. The Assistant Secretary shall perform the duties assigned by the Secretary.
- 3.5. The Treasurer shall:
 - 3.5.1. Supervise the accounting staff
 - 3.5.2. Be bonded in such amount as may be fixed by the BOT
 - 3.5.3. Deposit to the bank all monies received for placement by the BOT
 - 3.5.4. Disburse funds in accordance with duly authorized vouchers and checks signed by any two (2) of the official signatories
 - 3.5.5. Report all financial activities giving detailed statement of funds
 - 3.5.6. Be custodian of all funds, properties and assets of the Society including all important financial documents and records.
 - 3.5.7. Perform other duties the BOT may assign.
- 3.6. The Assistant Treasurer shall perform the duties assigned by the Treasurer.

RULE IV - THE ADVISORY BOARD

Section 1. The Advisory Board shall be composed of all Past Presidents. It shall choose from among its members a chair and a co-chair who shall serve for a period of two (2) years. The Incumbent President and Secretary shall sit as ex-officio members.

Section 2. Functions

- 2.1. Serve as an oversight body and participate actively in making decisions on crucial issues affecting the Society.
- 2.2. Act as consultant on matters that are controversial, difficult, or delicate based on the assessment by the BOT.
- 2.3. Guide the President in choosing the members of the SB and the HAB.

RULE V – MEETING OF REGULAR MEMBERS

Section 1. The meetings of the members shall be in accordance with the By-Laws. The exact date of the annual meeting shall be decided by the BOT and written notice or via electronic messaging service shall be sent to all members at least sixty (60) days before the date of said meeting.

Section 2. The agenda of the annual meeting shall be:

- 2.1. Call to order by the President
- 2.2. Roll call and declaration of quorum
- 2.3. Reading and approval of the minutes of last meeting
- 2.4. Matters arising from the minutes
- 2.5. Report of the different Committees and Council Directors
- 2.6. Report of the Secretary
- 2.7. Report of the Treasurer
- 2.8. Report of the BOT by the President
- 2.9. Unfinished and new business matters
- 2.10. Adjournment

Section 3. Annual Chapter Presidents' Meeting with the BOT

All Chapter Presidents, including their secretaries or designated representatives, shall attend this meeting called by the National President, prior to the annual convention. They shall be notified by the National Secretary via written notice or electronic messaging service not later than sixty (60) days prior to a date and time set by the Board.

RULE VI – FUNDS AND EXPENSES

Section 1. The annual dues and special assessments of the members shall constitute the funds of the Society. Funds may also be raised through voluntary contributions and other sources as may be determined by the BOT.

Section 2. All appropriations of funds above fifty thousand pesos (P50,000.00) shall be approved by the BOT and those above five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) shall be approved by the BOT in consultation with the Advisory Board.

Section 3. All disbursements shall be made in checks signed by the Treasurer and either the Vice President or President. In the absence of the Treasurer, the Vice President and President shall sign the checks. Financial documents and contracts shall be signed by the President, Treasurer and Secretary.

Section 4. All donations shall be kept and be administered within the Society.

RULE VII – MEDICAL ETHICS

Section 1. The Codes of Ethics of PMA, the PPS and the Professional Regulatory Board of Medicine shall govern the conduct of the members.

Section 2. All PPS members, especially national and chapter officers, shall monitor and report non-adherence of physicians to the Codes of Ethics. The violations shall be reported to the PPS Committee on Ethics which shall deliberate on the alleged violation, and if proven after due process, recommend to the BOT the appropriate sanction, such as reprimand, suspension, or expulsion from the PPS.

Section 3. Any physician found to have violated the Code of Ethics of PPS and the Professional Regulatory Board of Medicine shall be referred to the Commission on Ethics of the PMA Code of Ethics for appropriate sanction.

RULE VIII – ORGANIZATION OF CHAPTERS

Section 1. Chapters of PPS shall be organized according to the regional division of the Department of Health. These chapters shall be governed by the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of PPS and its Rules and Regulations. A new chapter may be organized in the same region subject to the criteria set by the BOT. A minimum number of fifty (50) members shall be required. The officers of the Chapters shall be elected at least thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Convention, and the election results shall be forwarded to the national secretariat within ten (10) days after election. The Chapter Presidents shall be inducted together with National officers and BOT.

Section 2. Duties of Chapter Presidents

- 2.1. Carry out projects as programmed by the BOT
- 2.2. Encourage or initiate research activities and other projects
- 2.3. Conduct and initiate regular scientific meetings
- 2.4. Report chapter activities not later than end of September and submit another report by the end of February to the National President.
- 2.5. Attend the annual Chapter Presidents' meeting
- 2.6. Submit roster of members to national office
- 2.7. Remit 50% of the annual membership dues to the national office

Section 3. Terms of Office

The Chapter president shall serve for a term of two (2) years and is coterminous with the incumbent National President.

RULE IX – ORGANIZATION OF CLUSTERS

Section 1. A cluster is a group of National Capital Region and Rizal Province-based, Philippine Pediatric Society Inc. board-certified pediatricians organized to support the activities of the Philippine Pediatric Society guided by its mission, vision, and goals. The Cluster Head shall be elected at least thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Convention, and the election results shall be forwarded to the national secretariat within ten (10) days after election. The Cluster Head shall be inducted together with National BOT.

Section 2. The NCR Clusters shall be based on the Districts of Metro Manila under the Department of Interior and Local Government and the Rizal Province which is not part of any PPS Chapter. These clusters shall be governed by the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of PPS Inc. and its Rules and Regulations.

The PPS NCR Clusters and component cities for each Cluster are as follows:

- 2.1. First Cluster – Manila
- 2.2. Second Cluster – Quezon City, San Juan, Mandaluyong, Pasig
- 2.3. Third Cluster – Caloocan, Malabon, Navotas, Valenzuela
- 2.4. Fourth Cluster – Makati, Parañaque, Pasay, Pateros, Taguig, Muntinlupa, Las Piñas
- 2.5. Fifth Cluster – Marikina
- 2.6. Sixth Cluster – Rizal Province (Uptown Cluster)

Section 3. Criteria for the Cluster Head

1. Shall be a Fellow of the PPS Inc. in good standing for at least five (5) years.
2. Shall be nominated by the hospital which he/she represents.
3. Shall be voted by the hospital representatives to be the Head of the Cluster. (Each cluster member hospital shall have a representative to the cluster. The non-hospital-based PPS member will be listed in the hospital nearest to his/her community practice.)
4. Shall have a term of two (2) years coterminous with the National BOT together with the cluster representatives of hospitals.

Section 4. Duties and Responsibilities of the Cluster Heads

1. Implement projects as programmed by the BOT.
2. Engage in institutional or individual research, scientific activities and community advocacies.
3. Encourage attendance to the PPS monthly scientific meetings.
4. Report cluster activities for inclusion in the PPS annual report.
5. Designate a representative among themselves to attend the annual joint Chapter and BOT meeting.
6. Submit the roster of members to national office.
7. Conduct a regular general cluster meeting.

RULE X – SPECIALTY BOARD (SB)

Section 1. A Specialty Board (SB) shall be nineteen (19) Fellows of the Society in good standing for past five (5) years. The members shall consist of:

1.1. Incumbent President as: Chair

1.2. Incumbent PPS Secretary (non-voting) as: Secretary

1.3. Members:

1.3.1. The former Chairs of the Department of Pediatrics, except the immediate Past Chair, of the first five (5) recognized medical schools in Metro Manila, University of Santo Tomas (UST), University of the Philippines (UP), Manila Central University (MCU), Far Eastern University (FEU), and University of the East (UE).

1.3.2. Thirteen (13) Fellows recommended by the Advisory Board and appointed by the President with the concurrence of the Board of Trustees, with any of the following requirements:

1.3.2.1. A past President of the Society

1.3.2.2. A previous member of the Specialty Board

1.3.2.3. A holder of an academic rank of Associate Professor or higher in a recognized medical school and a Former Chair of a Department of Pediatrics, except the immediate past Chair, for three (3) years of a hospital with LEVEL IV accredited residency training program.

1.3.2.4. A holder of an academic rank of Professor of Pediatrics in a recognized medical school and an active staff of the Department of Pediatrics of a Hospital with Level III or IV accredited residency training program.

1.3.3. A current chairperson of a HAB-accredited program shall not sit as a member of the Specialty Board.

1.3.4. When deemed necessary, the President shall deputize evaluators to assist the SB. They shall be Fellows of good standing of at least five (5) years and an Associate Professor in a recognized medical school.

Section 2. Functions:

2.1. General Functions:

- 2.1.1. To encourage the study, improve the practice and elevate the standards of neonatal, infant, child, and adolescent care.
- 2.1.2. To issue certification or other equivalent recognition of special knowledge in Pediatrics to duly licensed and qualified physicians.
- 2.1.3. All certificates issued by the PPS Accredited Subspecialty Board shall be signed by the PPS SB chair.

2.2. Specific Functions:

- 2.2.1. To establish standards by which the competence of a physician to practice Pediatric Medicine shall be determined
- 2.2.2. To give certification for Diplomates and Fellows
- 2.2.3. To have the sole authority to promulgate the requirements for certification, and reinstatement of members duly noted by the BOT. The SB reserves the right to reject any applicant and such action is final.
- 2.2.4. To recognize and coordinate subspecialty boards of subspecialty societies through the Council of Subspecialties and Sections

Section 3. The SB shall have autonomous power to promulgate rules governing certification, maintenance of certification, reclassification, and reinstatement of members.

Section 4. The SB shall recognize the certifications issued by the different PPS accredited subspecialty boards of pediatrics.

Section 5. SB funds shall come from the fees collected from the applicants of the two (2) SB examinations yearly.

Section 6. The SB shall meet for certification twice a year , the first before the annual convention in March and the second in September. There shall be no special or emergency meeting for certification. The meeting shall be held in a place which the presiding officer may designate, and the expenses shall be paid from the SB funds.

In the absence of the Chair during the meeting, an acting Chair shall be chosen from among the SB members present.

Section 7. Application for Membership

- 7.1. The candidates for Diplomates, Fellows, and Emeritus Fellows and special categories shall submit to the Secretary of the Society a duly accomplished application form and letter of intent with all the supporting papers by January 31 or July 31 of each year. These shall be the reference dates for the duration of training and years of practice.
- 7.2. All duly accomplished application forms with all supporting documents filed on time shall be equally distributed by the Secretary to the members of the SB and deliberated on two (2) weeks before the examination.
- 7.3. Upon request of a member of the SB, decision for certification, reclassification, and reinstatement of any applicant may be postponed to the next regular meeting for further deliberation.
- 7.4. It shall be the responsibility of the candidate to follow up the status of the application.
- 7.5. Upon completion of all requirements for Diplomate or for reclassification to Fellow or Emeritus Fellow, a certificate shall be issued only after the Diplomate or Fellow or Emeritus Fellow takes oath before an officially designated Inducting Officer at a designated time and place. The effectivity of the Diplomate or Fellow or Emeritus Fellow status commences at the date specified in the certificate.

RULE XI – HOSPITAL ACCREDITATION BOARD (HAB)

Section 1. The Hospital Accreditation Board (HAB) shall be seventeen (**17**) Fellows of the Society in good standing for at least five (5) years.

- 1.1. President – as Chair
- 1.2. Vice President - as co-chair
- 1.3. HAB Secretary
- 1.4. Immediate Past President
- 1.5. The following members shall be appointed by the President and approved by the BOT:
 - 1.5.1. Three (3) members from the SB
 - 1.5.2. Four (4) Past Presidents
 - 1.5.3. Six (6) appointees with a tenure of two (2) years each:
 - 1.5.3.1. Two (2) from Luzon
 - 1.5.3.2. Two (2) from the Visayas
 - 1.5.3.3. Two (2) from Mindanao
 - 1.5.3.4. HAB Secretary
- 1.6. The Board Secretary shall be a Fellow appointed by the President and approved by the BOT.

- 1.7. The Assistant Secretary of the BOT, an ex-officio member, shall perform the tasks assigned by the Board Secretary without voting right.
- 1.8. When deemed necessary, the President shall deputize accreditors to assist the HAB. They shall be Fellows who meet any of the following qualifications:
 - 1.8.1. Former hospital accreditation evaluator
 - 1.8.2. Past national president
 - 1.8.3. Former member of the HAB
 - 1.8.4. Current or past PPS chapter president
 - 1.8.5. Current or past chairman of Department of Pediatrics with at least Level III accreditation

Section 2. The functions of the Board are as follows:

- 2.1. Develop and regularly update the minimum and quality standards of the Pediatric Residency Training Program
- 2.2. Develop and regularly update the minimum and quality standards of the Subspecialty Fellowship Training Program in coordination with the Council of Subspecialties and Sections
- 2.3. Accredit hospitals for pediatric residency training program
- 2.4. Recognize subspecialty fellowship training programs that are accredited by the respective subspecialty societies and sections.
- 2.5. Offer Teacher Training Seminars, workshops, and lectures for Pediatric Consultant
- 2.6. Assist Department of Pediatrics in developing innovative strategies of implementing the department-selected curriculum
- 2.7. Administer formative In-Service examinations for residents-in-training.

Section 3. Accreditation Requirements and Fees

- 3.1. Accreditation documents must be submitted six (6) months before the expiration of the Centers' current accreditation.
- 3.2. Accreditation fees as determined by the HAB shall be paid upon submission of the accreditation or re-accreditation requirements.

Section 4. All HAB Accredited Hospitals at any level status may offer a Subspecialty Fellowship Training Program provided they have the capability as evidenced by the accreditation of the Subspecialty Society or Section and officially recognized by the PPS.

RULE XII – ICP FUND REVIEW BOARD

Section 1. ICP Fund is the Fund generated from the 17TH International Congress of Pediatrics on November 7-12, 1983.

Section 2. The ICP Fund Review Board shall be composed of the last seven (7) past presidents of the Philippine Pediatric Society, Inc.

This Board shall choose the Chairman from among its members who shall serve for a term of two years. The Incumbent PPS President, Treasurer and Secretary shall sit as ex-officio members with the last serving as Secretary of the Board.

Section 3. General Functions

- 3.1. Formulate guidelines for the disbursements of the ICP Funds with approval of the BOT.
- 3.2. Review the semi-annual ICP financial report as prepared by the PPS Treasurer and report to the BOT

Section 4. The ICP Fund Review Board shall meet at least twice a year and as needed.

RULE XIII – RESEARCH FUND REVIEW BOARD (RFRB)

Section 1. Composition

The RFRB shall be composed of:

- 1.1. President as Chair
- 1.2. Vice President
- 1.3. Secretary
- 1.4. Treasurer
- 1.5. Past Presidents with a term of 1, 2, and 3 years respectively based on their year of presidency with the most recent serving the full term
- 1.6. Incumbent Directors of the Council on Research and Publications

Section 2. Source of Funds

A certain percentage of the convention net income as determined by the BOT.

Section 3. Objectives

- 3.1. Promote and support scientific researches
- 3.2. Facilitate publication of researches
- 3.3. Formulate guidelines for funding research project proposals subject to approval by the BOT

Section 4. Functions

Under the direct supervision of the BOT, the Board shall:

- 4.1. Provide for acquisition, conservation, and management of PPS research funds
- 4.2. Approve research project proposals recommended for funding by the research forum board
- 4.3. Provide funding for PPS members as follows:
 - 4.3.1. Research Incentive Grants
 - 4.3.1.1. Research Professorial Chair
 - 4.3.1.2. Faculty Research Grant
 - 4.3.1.3. Consultants' Research Grant
 - 4.3.2. Research Assistance Grants for Non-Members
 - 4.3.2.1. Research Assistance Grant for Residents-in-training
 - 4.3.2.2. Research Assistance Grant for Fellows-in-training
 - 4.3.2.3. Research Assistance Grant for Regional Chapters
 - 4.3.3. Research Grant for Meritorious Researches
- 4.4. Ensure publication and dissemination of results of completed researches funded by RFRB
- 4.5. Submit a quarterly financial report to BOT

RULE XIV - THE PHILIPPINE JOURNAL OF PEDIATRICS

Section 1. The Philippine Journal of Pediatrics is the official publication of the PPS, Inc.

Section 2. The Board of Editors

The Board of Editors shall be appointed by the BOT.

Section 3. Term of Office

The members of the Board of Editors shall serve for a period of four (4) years without prejudice to re-appointment.

Section 4. The BOT shall appoint the Editor-in-Chief from among the members of the Editorial Board.

Section 5. Subscription Fees

For both printed and digital formats, a minimum subscription fee shall be charged to cover for the operational and maintenance expenses as well as the honorarium to be provided to the content reviewers and lay out artists for the journal. The subscription rates shall be determined by the Editorial Board subject to the approval of the BOT.

Section 6. Format

A digital or electronic format for the journal is preferred to minimize usage and wastage of paper. Nonetheless, a photocopy of the journal will be kept for documentation and archiving in the PPS Library.

Section 7. Frequency of Circulation

The digital or electronic format of the Philippine Journal of Pediatrics may be circulated at least twice (2x) a year to a maximum of every quarter depending on the availability of materials.

Section 8. Honoraria

Internal or in-house reviewers or guest reviewers known for their expertise in research may be invited and shall be provided with a reasonable honorarium based on prevailing fair market values.

- 1.5.3.2. Shall consist of at least ten (10) PPS fellows in good standing to serve as founding officers and members as incorporators
- 1.5.3.3. Members are graduates of formal fellowship training program and board certified
- 1.5.3.4. Shall have formal training program and recognized by PPS HAB
- 1.5.3.5. All sub-board certifications issued by the subspecialty society shall include the signature of the PPS President
- 1.5.3.6. The organization shall have its articles of incorporation and by-laws in consonance with those of PPS and shall be duly registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC)
- 1.5.3.7. Recognized Subspecialties

1.5.4. Sections

Members may include adult counterparts with similar fellowship training program completed and board certification recognized by their corresponding medical societies OR a heterogenous group of diplomates and fellows of the PPS with a shared special expertise and interest in areas that will redound to better child health care.

- 1.5.4.2. Shall consist of at least ten (10) PPS certified members
- 1.5.4.3. Head is appointed by the President
- 1.5.4.4. Shall have formal training program and sub-board for certification
- 1.5.4.5. Members are graduates of formal fellowship program, board certified by the section and board certified by PPS as diplomate or fellow
- 1.5.4.6. May apply for recognition as subspecialty society upon submission of articles of incorporation and by-laws in conformity with those of PPS, Inc. and approved by SEC

1.5.4.7. Functions

- 1.5.5.7.1. Promote programs other than those of any existing PPS Subspecialty Society
- 1.5.5.7.2. Adopt policies and guidelines in accordance with PPS goals
- 1.5.5.7.3. Coordinate with the PPS-SB the review of sub-board for certification created by the Sections

1.5.4.8. Recognized Sections:

Section 2. Each council may create such committees as deemed necessary to assist it in the discharge of its functions.

Section 3. Each council may adopt its own rules to govern its proceedings consistent with these Rules and Regulations subject to the approval of the BOT.

RULE XVI - DUES

Section 1. Annual dues shall be assessed from each member, the amount of which shall be determined by the BOT.

This includes a year's subscription to the Philippine Journal of Pediatrics. Dues and special assessments shall be payable upon admission to the Society and yearly thereafter. The regional chapters shall remit 50% of the fee collected from each member to the Mother Society.

Section 2. Any member who fails to pay dues for a period of three (3) consecutive years shall be dropped from the rolls after due process. However, reinstatement is possible upon recommendation by the SB and approved by the BOT provided all back dues are paid.

Section 3. The following shall be exempted from the payment of PPS, Inc. annual dues, and annual convention registration fees, and registration fees of other PPS Inc. recognized subspecialties.

- 3.1. Honorary Fellows
- 3.2. Emeritus Fellows
- 3.3. Past National and Chapter Presidents
- 3.4. Incumbent members of the BOT
- 3.5. Incumbent and Past Chapter Presidents
- 3.6. Incumbent Presidents of PPS Chapters, PPS Subspecialty Societies and PPS Section Heads

Section 4. Fellows in good standing who reached the age of 65 but do not qualify as Emeritus Fellows shall be exempted from payment of annual dues only.

Section 5. Corresponding members shall pay the amount in US dollars (USD) determined by the BOT annually.

RULE XVII – MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 1. None of the funds or earnings of the Society shall inure to the benefits of the members, trustees, or private persons, except those provided by the Rules and Regulations.

Section 2. In case of dissolution, the assets of the society shall accrue to an organization fostering the same goals and purposes upon the approval of the BOT subject to ratification by at least two-third (2/3) of the voting member of the PPS. All liabilities should first be settled. The guidelines provided by the SEC should be followed.

Section 3. All papers and reports presented to the Society shall become the exclusive property of the Society.

Section 4. If any provision of these Rules and Regulations is declared invalid by a competent authority, the rest of the provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid and effective.
